







Our Mission: Saint Joseph Parenting Center (SJPC) is a nonsectarian, nonprofit organization that strengthens families at risk of child abuse and neglect through parent education and community support programs. The CDC estimates 1 in 7 children suffers abuse each year. Our approach is to educate the parent in order to protect the child.

- SJPC opens its second center in Danbury, CT

Our Programs

- General Parenting Program (GPP): a curated 28-class curriculum focused on the essential parenting knowledge and life skills needed to parent positively.
- Dads are the Difference

 (DAD) Program: 30-class
 curriculum designed
 exclusively for dads;

 emphasizes the unique and complex role of a father.
 Includes additional Intimate
 Partner Violence (IPV) and Job Readiness programs.




• Case Management:

By the Numbers

- 2,150: # parents to date SJPC has helped
- 6,450: # parents, partners and children impacted by SJPC programs
- 85: % of parents served fall below the poverty line
- 68: % increase in awareness of protective factors that measure better outcomes for children
- 41/59: % men/women SJPC serves

Serving, Growing, Making a Difference

- SJPC served 20% more parents in FY22 (450) than in FY21 (359), continuing a double digit year over year build since opening our doors.
- SJPC is outpacing projections in parents served at the Danbury Center by 31% since its March '22 opening (parents served to date: 98).
- With its enhanced DAD program, SJPC served approximately 100 dads in 2021 and 2022.
